**Artists from all over the world at Bad RagARTz 2018**

**The 7th Swiss Triennial of Sculpture will take place in Bad Ragatz and Vaduz from May 5th to November 4th . 77 artists from 17 countries show over 400 works of art in the open air.**

77 artists from 17 countries, over 400 sculptures, 2,600 tons of art, a budget of 2.5 million Swiss francs – and free admission: this is the 7th Swiss Triennial of Sculpture. The organization of this world-famous open-air art spectacle is expecting several hundred thousand visitors in the St. Gallen spa town of Bad Ragaz and in the Liechtenstein capital of Vaduz. Inspiring works of art are not only encountered on both sides of the Rhine, the Bad RagARTz exhibitors are also present at the Festival of Small Sculptures in the Old Bad Pfäfers.

The initiators, the Bad Ragaz couple Rolf and Esther Hohmeister, and with them all the other forces are already full of anticipation and confidence, because the 7th Triennial should once again make a mark as an art beacon in Europe. "But we don't want to follow the old pattern, we don't want to dance to a given music, we don't want to repeat what is said to us". This announcement is evidence of the courage to embrace change. "It is a sign of strength if you don't sacrifice tradition in favor of something new," continues Rolf Hohmeister.

### **Well-known names create contrasts**

The works of art enrich the social space of residents and visitors for several months, the transformation of nature radiates a special charm during this time. The list of artists all includes illustrious names, such as Juan Andereggen (Switzerland/Argentina), Armin Göhringer (Germany), Xhixha Helidon (Albania), Alejandro Mondria (Mexico), Owais Husian (India), Sybille Pasche (Switzerland) or Helga Vockenhuber (Austria).

"It is our goal to capture the zeitgeist with the 7th Triennial and to continue thinking artistically and philosophically where others stop," says Esther Hohmeister. The effect of art in social space and in nature is reciprocal, the transition on the ten-kilometer-long Bad Ragaz Sculpture Trail from the village center to the recreation area is designed in a playful way. The 40 works of art in the center of Vaduz will be more compressed and rich in contrast.

This summer, the organizers of the world market Bad RagARTz want to build on the success of the past. The starting signal will be given on May 5th with a big ceremony in Bad Ragaz. There are no doors and no entry at Bad RagARTz 2018. All you need is the willingness to encounter art at every turn - individually, on full moon tours, jogging tours, art trips and other offers.

### **Material for discussions and thoughts**

The Bad RagARTz sculpture show brings together a large art family that is constantly growing in enthusiasm and scope. The motto this year is "Haste makes waste - linger". Behind the commitment of the Hohmeister couple is the idea of bringing art from museums out into the open to the public, to offer material for thoughts, things to do in common and discussions.

The newly created Swiss Sculpture Prize will be awarded for the first time at Bad RagARTz. Various events such as DorfART or the LiteraTour events enrich the sculpture show. The various guided tours for children and adults are already in great demand.

From the 5th of May till the 4th of November 2018 the 7th Swiss sculpture festival **Bad RagARTz** (<http://www.badragartz.ch>) takes place in Bad Ragaz (Switzerland) and Vaduz (Principality of Liechtenstein). 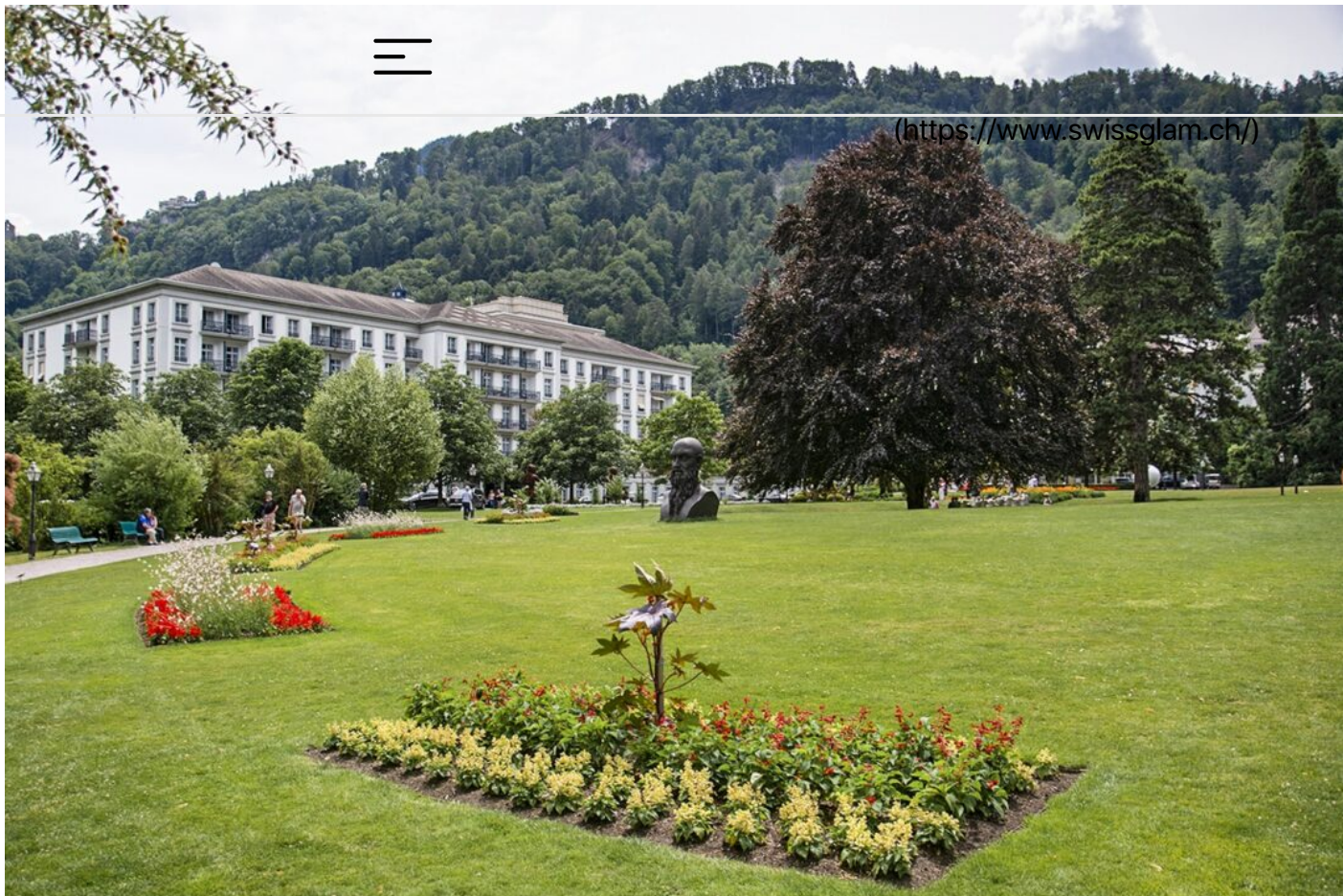

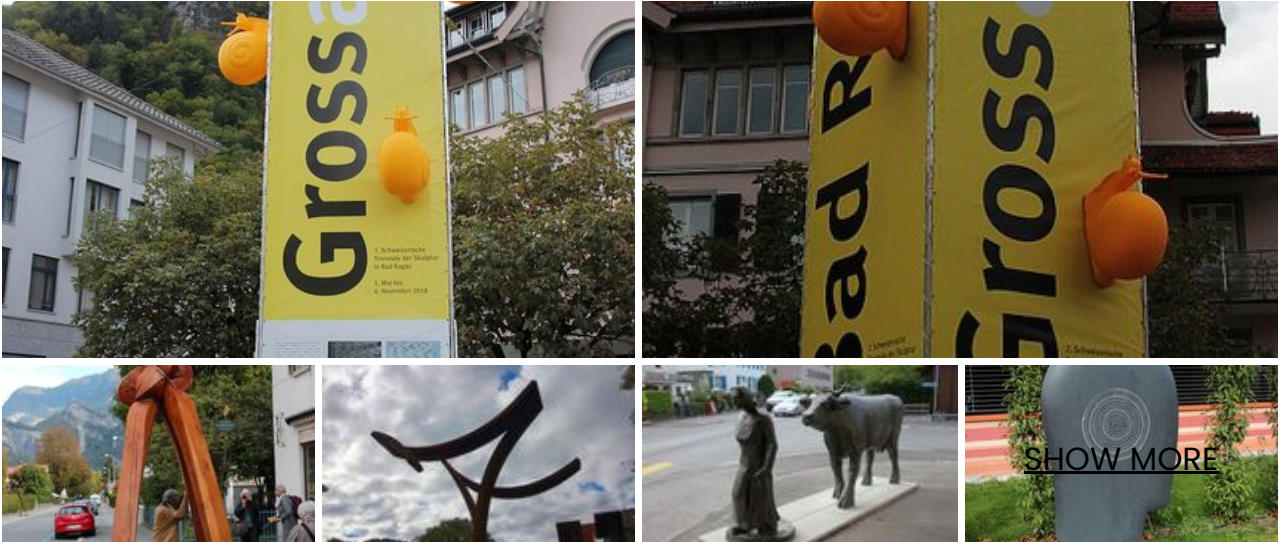
Europe's largest sculpture park
